## **Total Worker Health PDC**

The Southern Oregon chapter and the Cascade Chapter of the American Society of Safety Professionals will sponsor a Professional Development Workshop on Total Worker Health 101 on May 12<sup>th</sup> from 9AM to noon. This three-hour course is offered at no cost by the Oregon TWH Alliance and financial sponsors of the Southern Oregon ASSP chapter. The class is taught virtually by Dede Montgomery, Oregon Institute of Occupational Health Sciences, OHSU and Liz Hill, SAIF Corp.

The purpose of the Oregon Total Worker Health Alliance curriculum is to create and provide consistent and reproducible training that is research-based and supports current practice. This course is targeted especially to occupational safety and health professionals, although occupational health nurses, physicians, and wellness and human resource professionals will also benefit from attending.

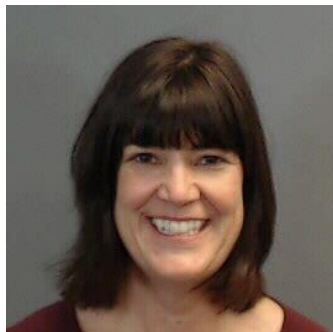
